Senator Dan Debicella

Dan is the State Senator from the 21st district, which includes Stratford, Shelton, Monroe, and Seymour. He is serving his second term in office. During his first term in office, he authored or co-sponsored a number of laws that are improving the quality of life for Connecticut families: Job Creation Tax Credits; Funding for Education and Anti-Dumping Environmental Legislation. Dan is Deputy Minority Leader, and serves as Ranking Senator on the legislature's Appropriations Committee, Public Health Committee, and Higher Education Committee.

Senator Andrew McDonald

Andrew was first elected in 2002 to serve the 27th Senate district (Stamford and Darien). The President Pro Tempore of the Senate appointed him, a freshman Senator, to serve as the Senate Chairman of the Judiciary Committee, a position he still holds today. He has championed a wide variety of legislative initiatives, including doubling and tripling criminal penalties for persistent violent felony offenders; enhancing protections for senior citizens in probate court proceedings; spearheading legislative efforts to implement civil unions and marriage equality and others.

**Mayor Dannel Malloy
Stamford**

In 2005, Dan was elected to his fourth term as Mayor of Stamford. He is the longest serving mayor in the history of Stamford. His leadership boasts vast reductions in crime, new affordable housing, and many improvements to an education system that competes with the nation's most prestigious public schools. Dan has worked to modernize the City's infrastructure, and his pragmatic financial management has enabled Stamford to make these investments while preserving its AA Bond Rating.

**Mayor Richard Moccia
Norwalk**

Dick was re-elected to a second term in 2007. He has a long history of public service for the City of Norwalk, having served as a member of the Common Council, Fire Commission, Fair Rent Commission, and Redistricting Committee. He is currently a member of the Connecticut Conference of Mayors Land Use Subcommittee (Chair) and U.S. Conference of Mayors Transportation and Water Quality Committee. He is a former member of the Governor's Early Childhood Research and Policy Council.

**The Stimulus Package:
What's in it for Me?**

President Obama signed into law the recently passed stimulus bill, H.R. 1, the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009. In addition to providing grants to the states and funding a variety of infrastructure investments, the new laws contains three provisions that will have varying degrees of impact on the commercial real estate industry: bonus depreciation, cancellation of debt (COD) income and Net Operating Loss carry back (NOL) relief. The American Recovery and Reinvestment Act is a nationwide effort to create jobs, jumpstart growth and transform our economy to compete in the 21st century. The compromise package of \$789 billion will create or save 3.5 million jobs over the next two years. Jobs created will be in a range of industries from clean energy to health care, with over 90% in the private sector. The number of jobs that could be created for Connecticut alone is predicted to be 41,000.
